Although there are plenty of scholarly studies within Religious Studies that involve children, the vast majority are of surprisingly low quality. This workshop will offer insight into carrying out fieldwork involving children and/or teenagers. By exploring how researchers often approach such fieldwork in a manner that harms the data, we will gain a sense for utilising methodologies that are optimal for research pertaining to children."

Joseph Chadwin is an FWF Fellow (2022-2025) in Religious Studies. Previously, he was a Doctoral Assistant at the Department (2020-2022).
