ENGLISH ACADEMIC WRITING

Contrary to times past, English has become the lingua franca of the contemporary academic scene. The vast majority of journals with high impact factor only accept submissions in English whereas internationally established publishers (for example, Routledge, Oxford University Press, Cambridge University Press, Wiley-Blackwell, and more) almost never publish monographs or edited volumes in languages other than English nowadays. Students will be able to discuss the benefits of publishing in English as well as the various benefits and pitfalls that English academic writing typically entails.

Nickolas P. Roubekas is Assistant Professor of Theories of Religion at the University of Vienna. He holds a B.A. in Theology (2003), an M.A. in Religious Studies (2006), an M.Res in Social Anthropology of Religions (2009), and a Ph.D. in the History of Religions (2011). He is the author and/or editor of eight books and the Editor-in-Chief of *NUMEN: International Review for the History of Religions*.
